Best Year Yet Foundation Launches Women & Girls in Tech Initiative

In partnership with the Paul Harr Memorial Fund and the JJ Keller Foundation, The Best Year Yet Foundation has launched its first initiative to support women and girls in technology by partnering with Women in Technology (WIT) – Wisconsin. This is the beginning of a year-long partnership to provide ongoing support to the organization in its mission to attract, grow, and retain women in technology-related careers. The partnership kicked off with the WIT-Wisconsin annual conference where Best Year Yet Foundation Executive Director Aaron Cohen facilitated a strategic planning workshop for the board of directors to elevate productivity and performance for 2020. On day two, he inspired the crowd of 150 attendees with his keynote presentation *Technology Beyond the Information Age*.

Paul passed away in 2018. His wife Cindy Harr created the Paul Harr Memorial Fund in his honor to continue his impact in areas he loved and supported in his life and work, including a grant for the Best Year Yet Foundation's work with WIT-Wisconsin.
